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International Recognition


On October 12, Mattie Miracle participated in a panel presentation at the 49th Congress of International Society of Paediatric Oncology (SIOP) in Washington, DC. SIOP is a global organization with over 1,000 members worldwide including doctors, nurses, other health-care professionals, scientists, and researchers.

Since 2012, Mattie Miracle has been committed to the development, publication, and now the implementation of evidence based [Psychosocial Standards of Care for Children with Cancer and Their Families](#). Mattie Miracle knows that childhood cancer is NOT JUST ABOUT THE MEDICINE, and comprehensive cancer care much include psychosocial support in order to achieve effective health outcomes. These evidence based Psychosocial Standards will ensure an optimal level of psychosocial care for children and families from the time of diagnosis, throughout treatment, into survivorship, or end of life and bereavement care.

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Sarcoma Textbook Features the Importance of Psychosocial Care

Mattie Miracle is committed to expanding the message that effective childhood cancer treatment must include a discussion of not only the medicine but psychosocial care. It is counter productive to address only the medical and pharmaceutical aspects of care, since research clearly indicates that children and their families are impacted psychologically, socially, and emotionally from cancer treatment. When children and their families are optimally supported, better treatment outcomes and enhanced quality of life are the results.

One of the ways the Foundation can share its message about comprehensive cancer care is through publications such as Sarcoma. Chapter 18 is entitled, *Psychosocial Issues in Children with Cancer: The Role of Patient Advocacy and Its Impact on Care*. This textbook details how a multidisciplinary team can be organized, integrated, and utilized in the care of sarcoma patients. We are grateful that Dr. Robert Henshaw (the book's editor) invited Mattie Miracle to author a chapter and that he values the role psychosocial care must play in the lives of cancer patients,
